Palm Sunday to Pentecost

Study 7: Pentecost.

Readings: John 14:15 - 27 Acts 2:1 - 21 1Corinthians 12:1 - 11

As Jesus taught his disciples on the night before his crucifixion Jesus taught about sending another counsellor, to assure them that they would not be alone and that they would be equipped for the role they were about to take on.

This role was to continue the ministry that Jesus had begun. They were to achieve so much more. The Book of Acts records this continued ministry as the Gospel was spread throughout the known civilized world.

That work continues to this very day as the Holy Spirit equips every Christian. The word continues to be shared. In Matthew 28:20 as Jesus gives the Great Commission, he promised to be with them until the very end of the age.
